

Welcome to the Aldford Village Hall newsletter, we hope to produce this half yearly to keep Aldford residents and businesses up to date about activities and events within the Hall and community facilities. In order to be inclusive we have decided to issue the newsletter in printed form, acknowledging that not all residents have digital access.

Aldford Village Hall is part of Grosvenor's Eaton Estate and is under a nominal rent lease to the Aldford Village Hall Trustees and Management Committee (AVHMC). It is a registered charity and AVHMC has a duty to manage the Village Hall, recreation grounds and ancillary property for the inhabitants of the Parish of Aldford "including for the use of meetings, lectures, classes, recreation and leisure, with the object of improving the conditions of life for the inhabitants of the Parish".

It currently costs around £15k per year to run the Hall - which is why we have an ongoing programme of fundraising events. Not all events are fundraisers though, as we feel that it is important to have activities and clubs that maintain and enhance the sense of community; we hope that you will continue to support these – please let us know if you have ideas for other events or activities that you would like to see happen at the Hall.


The Hall is also used as a community facility, such as for Parish Council meetings and as a Polling Station.

AUTUMN/WINTER 2024 EVENTS REPORT

Race Night (25 October 2024)

With thanks to Emma and Lily Nicholas another Race Night was held at the Hall with an excellent turn out and much fun had by all. Around £500 was raised for the Hall.

Hot Pot Supper and Antiques Evening (8 November 2024)

Early November saw a great turnout for a homemade hot pot supper and TV antiques celebrity Adam Partridge entertaining the audience of 60 people with his tales from his time in front of the camera and then turning to valuing some of the antiques brought along. Over £800 was raised by the AVHMC which will help with the running costs of the Hall.

Advent Fair (24 November 2024)

The Hall was filled with 14 stalls selling fudge, homemade crafts and gifts (including from a number of very talented Aldford residents), with mulled wine and mince pies helping get people into the festive mood. Around £600 was raised to go towards paying the Hall's winter heating bill!

Christmas Quiz (13 December 2024)

Grosvenor's Eaton Estate charity garden open days help to raise much needed funds for local charities by welcoming visitors to enjoy the gardens of Eaton Hall, home to the Duke and Duchess of Westminster. The Three Villages (Aldford, Eccleston and Saighton) are hosting the event on 13th July. The event includes charity fundraising stalls in the Courtyard, a band playing in the garden and a children's entertainer. Tickets are pre-book only (through Eventbrite), gates open for parking from 10am and the event runs from 10.15am until 5pm. Last entry is 4pm. The Gardens and Courtyard will be open - Eaton Hall is a private home and not open to the public. Children must be supervised at all times, dogs are welcome on a short lead and under close control. Light refreshments are available at the Courtyard and at various points from mobile vendors around the gardens and you are welcome to bring your own picnic.

DID YOU KNOW?

- In addition to the Hall and the Bowling Green, AVHMC are responsible for the car park, Aldford Playing Field and Cruck Barn, supported by Eaton Estate who carry out the mowing and vegetation management on the field and playground and external maintenance of the Hall
- Aldford Village Hall now has wifi thanks to a grant from CWaC's Rural Connection Programme and installation by local firm, Kingsley Communication
- The Hall has an excellent catering kitchen
- The Hall has seating capacity for 100 people
- The Hall has table tennis tables and the floor is marked out for badminton let us know if you are
 interested in setting up a family friendly table tennis or badminton group, especially during the weekend
- There is a community defibrillator (originally funded by the Parish Council) located in the Hall porch; in the unfortunate event that you need to use it the access code is shown on the cabinet door
- The defibrillator has been used twice in the last year to provide life-saving first aid
- Drop down screens and a sounds system are installed and available for use to hirers of the Hall thanks to a grant from CWaC, installation and support by Grosvenor Communications and Richer Sounds
